# ANNUAL EDUCATION REPORT FOR NORTHSIDE CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER 2011-2012

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2011-2012 educational progress for Northside Child Development Center. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) and teacher quality. Adequate Yearly Progress provides information from assessments, graduation, and attendance rates and AYP status in relation to four criteria. Adequate Yearly Progress does not apply to Northside Child Development Center due to the young (preschool, kindergarten) student population. There is no AYP reported for Northside for the 2010-2011 school year, or for the 2011-2012 school year.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

#### 1. PUPIL ASSIGNMENT

<u>2010-2011</u>—Kindergarten students were assigned to Northside based on their address and parent preference. Parents have the option of completing an intra-district request form. Early Childhood Special Education students (ECSE), Head Start students, and Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) students are placed in their respective programs based on special education, Head Start, and GSRP eligibility requirements as determined by the state and federal government. Northside meets all requirements for, and is licensed as, a Michigan Child Care Licensed facility.

<u>2011-2012</u>—Kindergarten students were assigned to Northside based on their address and parent preference. Parents have the option of completing an intra-district request form. Early Childhood Special Education students (ECSE), Head Start students, and Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) students are placed in their respective programs based on special education, Head Start, and GSRP eligibility requirements as determined by the state and federal government. Northside meets all requirements for, and is licensed as, a Michigan Child Care Licensed facility. Northside offers both full day and half day kindergarten options. We serve 68 Head Start, and 96 GSRP students annually.

## 2. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

<u>2011-2012</u>—The 3-5 year school improvement plan is available on our website, is posted in the hall, and is available for review in the Northside school office. All goals were achieved for the 2011-2012 school year. Specific data is posted in the hall at school and is available in the Northside office.

<u>2010-2011</u>—Niles Community Schools has adopted the Common Core State Standards. This is the curriculum for Kindergarten students at Northside. The Common Core State Standards are available on the Michigan Department of Education website, and are also available upon

request in the Northside school office. The Head Start and GSRP programs utilize "Creative Curriculum", which is available for review in the Northside office.

<u>2011-2012</u>—Niles Community Schools has adopted the Core Curriculum State Standards. This is the curriculum for Kindergarten students at Northside. The Common Core State Standards are available on the Michigan Department of Education website, and are also available upon request in the Northside school office. The Head Start and GSRP programs utilize "Creative Curriculum", which is available for review in the Northside office.

#### 4. AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT DATA

<u>2010-2011</u>—NWEA aggregate data for kindergarten students is available on the Niles Community Schools curriculum website. Head Start and GSRP student outcome data is available for review in the Northside office.

<u>2011-2012</u>—NWEA aggregate data for kindergarten students is available on the Niles Community Schools curriculum website, and is posted in the hallway at Northside. Head Start and GSRP student aggregate data is posted on the Northside web site, is available for review in the Northside office, and is posted in the hallway at Northside. We are pleased with our student achievement data for 2011-2012 as measured by our *kindergarten* NWEA RIT growth in both reading and math, and "Child Development and Early Learning Framework Goals" outcomes in both math and reading for our *preschool* students.
